Character - Essential

- To be an evangelical Christian, committed to living under the authority of God's word as revealed in the Bible, being in agreement with the Evangelical Alliance Statement of Faith.
- To live an authentic lifestyle of obedience to Christ.
- To be active in befriending unbelievers and seeking to share the gospel personally and hungry to see God's Kingdom grow.
- To be rooted in a life of prayer, Bible reading, worship, service and devotion to God, and willing to submit to the authority of scripture.
- To be filled with the Holy Spirit and be a person of prayer devoted to serving Christ in His Church.
- To support Union Baptist Church's Vision, Mission and Values Statement.
- To have a calm demeanour and ability to put others at ease.
- To be creative, enthusiastic and able to inspire others.
- To be a servant hearted team player who is committed to the life of the church and actively supporting the Church Leadership.
- To be teachable and willing to commit to ongoing development and training.
- To have the ability to establish and maintain good relationships with the diverse fellowship and community.

- To use their own initiative and have organisational and motivational skills.
- To be computer literate and familiar with the use of social media.
- To have good oral and written communication skills.
